Acelero-Shine Early Learning	Shine Insight is designed to keep programs in compliance with Federal Standards using a real-time, role-based data dashboards--customized and prioritized for key roles so your team can focus its energy on children and families. Shine Insight provides continuous T/TA Program Design and Management, Family Engagement, Early Learning/Health
Asthma-Impact DC	Provides annual education outreach events to parents and staff; provides education materials to program. Serves on Mazique-Health/Nutrition/Education/Parent-Engagement-Advisory Committee; participates in annual Community Health Fair.
Capital Area Food Bank	Provide foods to prepare baskets for families at Thanksgiving and Christmas and when needed.
Community of Hope	Provides health care services to Mazique-enrolled children and families: including medical, dental, prenatal education, behavioral and wellness education. Provides and refers children, including families in the homeless program for Mazique EHS-CCP infant-toddler care and education.
DC Department of Health	Provides vision screenings and referrals, and support from the Oral Health Division.
Developing Families Center	This organization coordinates a collaboration of nonprofit service providers, including Community of Hope, offering comprehensive, one-stop, family-centered women’s and children’s health care, child care, family resource/support, case management, home visiting, counseling, and adult education. Programs include The Healthy Babies Project, Teen Parenting Empowerment, Effective Black Parenting, Developing Dads fatherhood program, walk-in HIV testing, pregnancy testing, family planning counseling, teen pregnancy prevention education, clothing and housing assistance, assistance with obtaining food stamps, supplemental and emergency food aid, free laundry, and a WIC mobile unit.

<p>OSSE –DC Strong Start Early Intervention Program (DC-EIP)</p>	<p>Provides Part C early intervention services including pediatric occupational, physical and speech and language therapy. Provides DC EIP Child Find materials including eligibility requirements to staff and families; ensures staff are trained on usage of the developmental tool <i>Ages and Stages</i>; provides referrals for children to support five developmental areas, assessment/eligibility for Part C Services; provides TA to support care coordinator.</p>
<p>Prevention of Blindness Society of Metro Washington</p>	<p>Provides annual children’s vision screenings/reports for follow-up and referral, glaucoma screening at annual health fair. Member of Mazique Health/Nutrition/Education/Parent Engagement Advisory Committees.</p>
<p>Strengthening Families and Communities Coalition – DC</p>	<p>Addresses challenges of families of the greater DC area: Childhood Development, Fatherhood, Mental Health, Public Safety, Communication through information sharing, policy formation and collaboration. Provides training to families on effective approaches for reducing the likelihood of abuse and neglect of young children from birth to age five. Assists staff in identifying symptoms of young children who are subject to the highest rates of maltreatment the greatest risk of lifelong harm.</p>
<p>DC Public Schools Special Education Office</p>	<p>Provides programs/services in inclusive settings for 3-5-year-old children identified as having a disability and in need of special education and related services. Coordinates Child Find activities.</p>
<p>United Planning Organization, Foster-Grandparent Program</p>	<p>Places volunteers in centers to assist children and staff in classroom activities. Serves as a role model for children.</p>
<p>University of the District of Columbia Community College</p>	<p>Provides classroom observation of children for nursing students’ practicum; participatory experiences for children; Annual Community Health Fair-screens for blood pressure, BMI, heights/weights, head circumference of children; Member of Mazique-Health/Nutrition/Education/Parent-Engagement Advisory Committees.</p>

<p>University of the District of Columbia, Center for Nutrition, Diet, and Health</p>	<p>Provides health, nutrition, and food safety education programs for children and families. Provides dietetic field experiences for students to work onsite for a 13-week period; provides learning experience to children; conducts health, nutrition, and food safety education programs for children and families. Promotes healthy eating habits and physically active lifestyles to help SNAP-ED families. Supports disease prevention for children/families that have risk factors; Provides chef for Cooking Matters Satellite program. Member of Mazique Health/Nutrition/Education/Parent-Engagement-Advisory Committees.</p>
<p>University of the District of Columbia Speech and Language Pathology</p>	<p>Clinical education-graduate students/professors provide clinical speech-language screening and follow-up; Participates in annual Community Health Fair; serves on Mazique's Health/Nutrition/Education/Parent-Engagement-Advisory Committees.</p>
<p>Children's National Health System (WIC)</p>	<p>WIC provides nutrition education and healthy foods enabling families to make lifelong healthy eating and lifestyle choices.</p>
<p>SYSCO</p>	<p>Provides food services and donations during Save Our Season allows us to provide Thanksgiving baskets for children and families during the Holidays.</p>
<p>DC Farmer's Market</p>	<p>Allows families to use the WIC, SNAP, and/or TANF benefits to purchase fresh fruits and vegetables.</p>
<p>Holland and Knights, LLC.</p>	<p>Provides Christmas gifts to each child during Save Our Season</p>

Dr. Habib Shariat, MD	Provides weekly on-site preventive health services to ECMPCC, Inc. The services can include immunizations, physicals, referrals, and the evaluations of any acute conditions as well as being an active member of the Health Advisory Committee.
NAEYC/ DCAEYC/DCHSA	Promote high-quality early learning for all young children, Birth through age 8, by connecting early childhood practice, policy, and research using a diverse, dynamic early childhood profession and support all who care for, educate, and work on behalf of young children.

DC Collaborative	Provides trainings such as SAFE SLEEP DC which educates parents on how to reduce the risk of SIDS through demonstrations and hands-on training.

<p>U.S. Committee of Refugees and Immigrants</p>	<p>Provides on-site low-cost, professional legal representation to low-income refugees and immigrants and their families with family- and humanitarian-based immigration matters before the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS), Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), the Executive Office for Immigration Review (EOIR), and the Department of State (DOS).</p>
<p>Unity Church of DC</p>	<p>Provides a monthly monetary donation to support the center's special activities/projects.</p>
<p>Mt. Gilead Baptist Church</p>	<p>Provides volunteer support for special agency projects during Save Our Season and throughout the year.</p>
<p>Briya Public Charter School-Community Resources</p>	<p>Provides families with a rich, culturally sensitive learning environment, helping both parent and child to move towards academic, social, and economic success through an approach called two-generation learning which includes career reading training as well as workforce development.</p>
<p>Mary's Center</p>	<p>Provides a comprehensive, integrated set of health care, workforce development and education and social services to help individuals and families achieve physical and mental health and overcome the life challenges they face. Mary's Center looks beyond health problems, asking participants questions about their neighborhood, jobs, housing, education, and the well-being of other family members. Listening to participants helps us to determine how the center can work with families to relieve the stress in their lives and build a solid base for improving their health, education, and economic situation.</p>
<p>Collaborative Solutions for Communities</p>	<p>Provides services for families such as family re-housing stabilization, Safe Sleep DC (provides Pack-And-Play's to families), Truancy prevention, training to help improve parenting skills and workforce development.</p>

<p>A Wider Circle</p>	<p>Provides services that may be considered “basic needs” especially for families transitioning out of shelters, escaping domestic violence, or just living without their basic needs. These basic needs include: beds, dressers, tables, chairs, pots and pans, and other items needed for a home. They also provide families with professional development training where each family receives their own professional development coach and assistance with resume writing, interview skills and offered job placement.</p>

<p>DC Department of Employment Services-Marion S. Barry, Jr. Summer Youth Employment Program</p>	<p>Provides summer youth workers June – August each year</p>
<p>DC Child and Family Services Agency</p>	<p>In collaboration with this agency, Mazique is able to report child abuse and neglect 24 hours a day, seven days a week. The hotline is the gateway to protection and help for child victims and those at risk up to age 18 in the District of Columbia.</p>
<p>Bread For The City</p>	<p>Provides low income DC residents assistance with food, clothing, medical care, and legal and social services to reduce the burden of poverty.</p>
<p>Greater Washington Urban League</p>	<p>Provides housing counseling, emergency services to assist with utilities, and workforce development.</p>
<p>DC Metropolitan Police and Fire Departments</p>	<p>Assist in collaboration with CFSA to ensure the safety of children as well as provide trainings for children during Fire Prevention Week.</p>
<p>Help Me Grow DC</p>	<p>A program of the Department of Health which connects families to developmental and behavioral resources for their children (ages 0-5) and pregnant women.</p>

<p>DC Department of Behavioral Health – (DC Healthy Futures)</p>	<p>The Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation Project, known as the Healthy Futures Program, operates in 24 child development centers located throughout the District. Consultation focuses on improving the overall quality of the program and assisting staff to solve a specific issue that affects more than one child, staff member, or family. <p>Serve DC</p>	<p>Serve DC engages District communities by building partnerships and organizational capacity, leading local and national volunteer and service initiatives, and providing and promoting meaningful service opportunities. Serve DC supports communities across the District through federal grant funds from the Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS) and the US Department of Homeland Security.</p>
